Senator Graham is recognized for his leadership on a wide variety of public issues. He is perhaps best known at the national level for his ten years of service on the U.S. Senate's Select Committee on Intelligence – including eighteen months as chairman in the aftermath of the 9/11 tragedy. Following the release of the Joint Inquiry's final report in July, 2003, Senator Graham became an outspoken advocate for reform of our nation's intelligence services. In the fall of 2004 he published *Intelligence Matters: The CIA, the FBI, Saudi Arabia and the Failure of America's War on Terror*. This important book, which was revised and issued in paperback in 2008, presents harsh judgments and lessons on national intelligence gleaned from the joint inquiry and from the Senator's analysis of the run up to the Iraq war.
